

# SCHOLARSHIPS

We could write a book about the number of scholarships we have at UNSW. But for now we're just going to give you a quick teaser. The following tables present a sample of what's on offer. A comprehensive list of scholarships with detailed information on value, tenure, eligibility, conditions, application procedures and closing dates are available on the UNSW Scholarship website.

Notable ones include the **Malcolm Chaikin Scholarship**, worth \$15,000 per annum over four years. Selection is based on academic merit, interview performance, the reasons for undertaking the course, demonstrated ability and personal qualities including the potential to contribute to the wider life of the university.

**The EnergyAustralia Electrical Engineering Scholarship** (\$14,000 per annum (taxable) over five years) was established to encourage high achieving students to study Electrical Engineering at UNSW, and to undertake relevant industrial training at EnergyAustralia. Recipients undertake industrial training with EnergyAustralia for 12 weeks in the summer vacation periods at the end of Years One, Two and Three of the program, plus one week each July and 48 weeks from March of Year Four.

**The Roads and Traffic Authority, (NSW) (RTA) Scholarships** (\$13,500 per annum over four years) have been established to encourage and assist high achieving students to undertake undergraduate studies in Civil Engineering and Surveying and Spatial Information Systems at UNSW and work experience with the RTA. A number of scholarships are also available for rural students (see page 46).

**The UNSW Scientia Scholarships** (\$10,000 per annum over four years) were established in 2006 to encourage the top students in NSW to study at UNSW. Students who receive a UAI of 99.9 or above in their NSW HSC and select UNSW as one of their UAC preferences, will automatically qualify and be contacted by UNSW. Additional benefits include the appointment of a senior academic mentor, the opportunity to occupy positions of academic leadership and the ability to discuss organising a flexible academic program directly with the Dean.

**The UNSW Co-op Program** (\$13,400 per annum over four years) is a scholarship program set up by industry and UNSW. Apart from the financial contribution, the scholarship includes compulsory industrial training of between 9 and 18 months throughout the duration of the program.

**The Faculty of Engineering Rural Scholarships Program** (\$8,500 per annum over four years) was established to encourage and assist students from rural and isolated areas of Australia to undertake one of more than 30 full-time engineering programs in the Faculty of Engineering at UNSW. Up to 20 scholarships are available, including several sponsored by industry that offer recipients the opportunity to undertake industrial training during summer vacations. Selection is

based on academic merit, interview performance and personal qualities (for example, extracurricular activities, evidence of leadership skills and potential to contribute to the wider life of the University). Consideration may also be given to any economic circumstances.

**The Faculty of Engineering Linkage Scholarships Program** (\$8,500 per annum over four years) was established to encourage high quality local students to undertake a full-time program in the Faculty of Engineering. Scholarships are funded by industry and provide the opportunity for students to undertake industry placement with the company sponsoring their scholarship.

A number of scholarships for **international students** are available, including the UNSW Golden Jubilee Scholarships that provide tuition fees for the minimum program duration. The Scholarships were established to encourage outstanding Diplomates from Singapore and Malaysia to complete an undergraduate degree at UNSW.

UNSW also has **sports scholarships**, various **indigenous scholarships** and a variety of **other schemes** to help make your life at university that little bit easier.

The **closing date for applications** for many of the available undergraduate scholarships is late September, however dates vary. You should visit the UNSW Scholarships website or contact the Scholarships and Financial Support Office directly.

**New scholarships** are regularly posted to the UNSW Scholarships website, and application forms for some scholarships may be available for downloading.

Scholarship help available is not just confined to first-year undergraduates. There are **additional scholarships** available for second and later year students, for overseas travel, and for vacation periods.

Unless otherwise noted Scholarships are not liable for taxation.

Applicants should note that the scholarships and their conditions (including availability and value) are subject to review and the closing dates for awards may vary from year to year. Scholarships are payable for the duration specified, subject to the continued satisfactory progress of the recipient as a full-time undergraduate student in the relevant program at UNSW.

# RURAL SCHOLARSHIPS

The University of New South Wales offers one of the country's most prestigious engineering programs, a fact which attracts many rural students to move to Sydney for their tertiary education.

To help rural students relocate to Sydney and achieve a successful transition to university study, UNSW and a host of industry partners and private donors offer a range of scholarships that will contribute toward living costs and the purchase of relevant course materials.

**“Rural students make great engineers. Because of their background and the environment they have grown up in, they have a very practical and realistic approach to problem-solving and they are usually highly motivated. We would love to have more students like them in the Faculty of Engineering,”** said Associate Dean (Academic), Professor Dianne Wiley.

Each year the Faculty of Engineering Rural Scholarship Program has approximately 20 scholarships, valued at \$8,500 per annum (tax free) for four years, available for rural students who undertake one of more than 30 full-time engineering programs offered by the Faculty of Engineering at UNSW. Past students have found the scholarship funds have helped them substantially, allowing them to concentrate more fully on their studies. Also, as part of the Program, several on-campus student residential colleges have agreed to set aside some of their first year places for successful Engineering Rural Scholarship applicants; and a Faculty of Engineering Rural Mentor is available to provide recipients with assistance and guidance in their studies.

Selection is based on academic merit, interview performance and personal qualities (for example, extracurricular activities, evidence of leadership skills and potential to contribute to the wider life of the University). Consideration may also be given to any economic circumstances.

**“My first year of study at UNSW went relatively smoothly. I was able to do reasonably well in all my subjects academically whilst still maintaining a balance with social activities. Academically the first year of study was as I expected, tough at times and definitely very different from high school, yet decent marks were still achievable.”**

There are many other scholarships available specifically for rural students including: the UNSW Country Scholarships for rural students who are undertaking the first year of an undergraduate program and may face social or economic circumstances that would hinder their coming here; the Bernard William Gould Scholarship (\$8,500 per annum over four years) was established to encourage students from rural Australia to undertake undergraduate study in the School of Civil and Environmental Engineering at UNSW; and the RTA Rural Scholarships in Civil Engineering (\$8,500 per annum over four years), established to encourage and assist high achieving students from rural or isolated areas of New South Wales to undertake undergraduate studies in Civil Engineering at UNSW and approved industrial training at RTA.
